Primary Physical Education and Sports Premium

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has announced that it is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. The money must be used to improve the provision of P.E. and school sport.

On 6th February 2014 the Prime Minister, David Cameron committed to continue the funding for the Primary PE & Sport Premium until **2020**.

Purpose of funding

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. The funding should ensure:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools

Sports Premium aims 2017 – 2018

Development of planning, rich curriculum coverage and teacher CPD.

- Continue and finalise planning for foundation/KS1/KS2.
- Show clear progression through teaching.
- Provide a rich alternative curriculum.
- Support with staff CPD and assist with teaching through team teaching.

Subject CPD, after school clubs, participation, and achievement.

- To enhance after school provisions by:
 - a. encouraging and developing sporting achievements
 - b. participation.
- Team teaching (specialist knowledge) with staff in highlighted areas.

Active breaks and lunch times.

- Playground marking to encourage children to participate in active games in non-teaching times.
- Further development of the play leader role; training via new sports provider.
